CLOSING PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

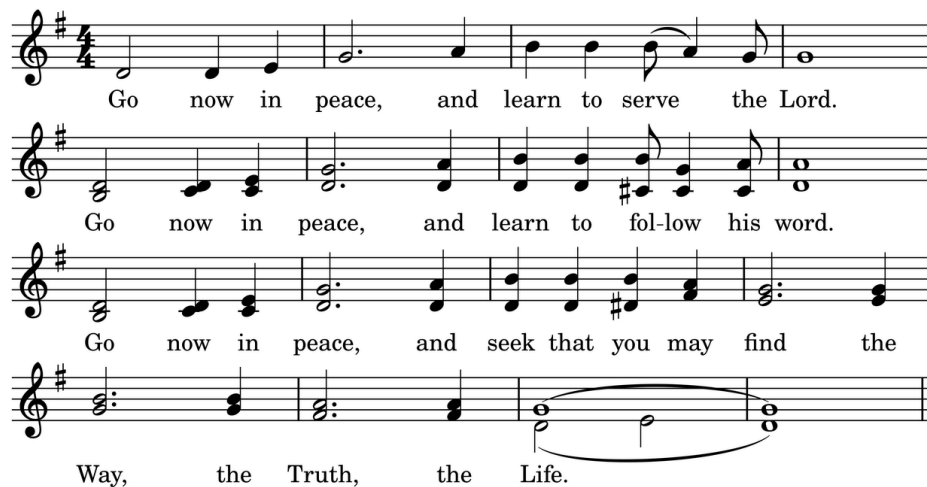
Celebrant Let us pray:
